

Puerto Suello – Transit Center Connector

LOCATION

Between Mission Avenue and the San Rafael Transit Center (San Rafael)

COST

\$1,300,000 (estimated)

FUNDING SOURCES

NTPP \$600,000; Safe Routes to Transit \$600,000; \$100,000 shortfall

COMPLETION DATE

August, 2011 (estimated)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will provide a combination of Class I multi-use path and Class III bike route between the San Rafael Transit Center and the Puerto Suello Hill Pathway (Project 2302). The planned alignments include a Class I separated pathway along Hetherton Street and Fourth Street, Class II bike lanes on Tamalpais Avenue between Mission and Fourth, and sidewalk and signage improvement on Tamalpais Avenue between Fourth and Second. In conjunction with improvements to the Transit Center (Project 601) this project could encourage greater transit usage by providing safe access for cyclists and pedestrians to the transit center from the north.

POINTS OF INTEREST

This project is a key link in the North/South Bikeway, connecting the Puerto Suello path and points north with the transit center, downtown San Rafael, and points south. The transit center is a major hub for Golden Gate Transit, Marin Transit, Airporter, and other transit services within Marin as well as San Francisco and the East Bay.

STATUS

Final project design issues are being resolved.

ABOUT WALKBIKEMARIN

WalkBikeMarin is an initiative by the County of Marin to help make Marin more healthy, livable, and environmentally sustainable by encouraging walking and bicycling as everyday transportation. This initiative was catalyzed by a recent \$25 million federal grant to fund the Nonmotorized Transportation Pilot Program (NTPP).
