PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will provide a pedestrian and cycling path to connect Bridgeway to the Sausalito Ferry Terminal, currently separated by a large parking lot. The waiting area for ferry passengers is minimal such that queues frequently spill out into the parking lot. Providing a clear and attractive path of travel will improve access to the ferry terminal as well as aesthetically enhance this major activity area.

POINTS OF INTEREST

This area of downtown is extremely busy with residents and tourists alike, many of whom use the ferry to get to and from San Francisco. The pathway would provide an attractive link to the shops and restaurants from the ferry and improve public amenities around the ferry landing.

STATUS

WalkBikeMarin is an initiative by the County of Marin to help make Marin more healthy, livable, and environmentally sustainable by encouraging walking and bicycling as everyday transportation. This section of El Portal is underutilized and offers opportunities to widen the sidewalk to create the promenade. A widened walkway would enable adjacent restaurants to offer outdoor seating looking out at the nearby fountain and bay.



The parking lot and roadway are a visual and physical barrier between downtown and the ferry landing. Rearrangement of this space will provide an attractive linkage to the waterfront.
