PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project funds various bicycle and pedestrian facility signing and striping projects countywide. These funds are directed to multiple smaller projects that close gaps, address safety concerns, and improve conditions for pedestrians and cyclists and include improved signage, bike lanes, crosswalks, and other enhancements.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Pedestrian and cycling network gaps can result in perceptions of unsafe conditions by potential users of the facility and discourage walking and bicycling. Many of these types of projects are minor in scope but compete for funding with other projects of greater magnitude. Closing these smaller gaps in the walking and bicycling network can aid in encouraging more walking and bicycling.

STATUS

Phase 1 projects have been completed. Phase 2 projects on hold pending resolution of financing package.
